Biwater signs Memorandum of Understanding with Ugandan Government to expand water supply and sanitation infrastructure

Surrey, UK – 6 September 2024: Biwater has signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the National Water and Sewerage Corporation (NWSC) of the Government of Uganda, marking a significant step in the expansion of the country's water supply and sanitation infrastructure.
